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

It all started with a whisper from God two or three years ago; God was calling me to follow my heart and do a fundraiser race for the work of Carmen Ministries. I had started running again three years ago, and I know now that I was running for more than myself. I was running for the thousands of "teens-at-risk" that need a second chance and an opportunity to follow their dreams for a better life.

Carmen Ministries had a great inaugural 10K Thanksgiving Day "Break into Education" race. The race took place at picturesque Duke Island Park in Bridgewater, N.J.

The funds raised will be used in support of the Carmen Ministries' programs for those pursuing the dream of obtaining a secondary education and becoming a positive, responsible, contributing adult.

The volunteers made the race GREAT. All the volunteers jumped into the new project with enthusiasm and excitement. A community of people came together and made a difference.

The volunteers showed up at the Park on Thanksgiving morning at 7:30. to setup the registration, goodie bag, and refreshment tables. There was excitement in our hearts as it all started to come together. Banners were being hung and the course was being marked. Then the runners started to show up!

The race offered the runners a flat and fast course. It was a cold morning, but the rain held off — an answer to prayer. The race started on time at 10 a.m., and Dan Miller led the runners on his bike so there would be no confusion on the course. We had volunteers marshalling the course at two water stations and at the finish line. One of the volunteers commented about how excited and happy the runners were crossing the finish line.

One runner was an Elizabeth High School teacher. He came to support our mission because of all the dropouts he encounters. Another runner was a pastor who had previously been involved in prison ministry and wanted to support our mission; his teenage daughter joined him and received a medal for placing second in her age group.

This race raised the public awareness of Carmen Ministries to a new height. We reached the running community and the corporate sponsor community with the Carmen Ministries' mission.

At the completion of the race, we all gathered together under the Oak Grove Pavilion for the award ceremony. The first award was given to a six-month old girl who completed the race in a stroller with her dad; God put his final touch on the race as it started to snow. It was a magical moment like in the movie, "It's a Wonderful Life."

We all cleaned up and headed to our Thanksgiving Day celebrations being blessed and being a blessing.

Thanks to everyone, and we look forward to next year's race. God's grace TRULY is sufficient!

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Excerpts from Letters from Our Young Men

At this time of year, we think about Christmas and its message of love, joy and hope. For the young men who have been touched by life's harshest elements, hope is something desperately needed. Below are a few excerpts from letters sent to Carmen Ministries from some of these children of God that we minister to. Most have known the pain, fear and suffering that life can bring that, but they also persevere with the message of hope and give inspiration to us all.

I look at my own life and see, upon my release, that I have nothing. But through my walk, God has opened my eyes to my sin and today I'm grounded on the rock of Jesus Christ and the Lord WILL open the doors. I regret the paths I took, but the Lord was always there for me and always will be.

I missed a father figure to teach me things, defend me in situations, etc., so I turned to the streets for that affection. Money became my main concern and led me to the situation I am in right now (incarceration). But at the same time, this was the best thing that happened to me, because on this journey I met my Father... I met the most lovable and sincere people while in jail. I gave my life to Jesus through a brother's testimony.

I'm 20 years old...and have been in and out of shelters all my life. I made friends with the wrong people and started doing drugs at the age of 17, and I was doing drugs every time I got money in my hands. I would even sell my body at times to get money to get a hotel, because I did not want to sleep on the street in the cold. But today the C.O. was handing out mail; I never get mail so I sat down. But the C.O. came to the door and gave me a Bible. I told him I never read the Bible before and he told me, "It's never too late." I opened up the Bible to the first page and that's where I got your address from. It said, "Jesus loves you no matter what." I was crying because I never felt loved before.

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I just feel like I can't slip up with anything because I got a lot of brothers always looking at me and I feel like I gotta be an example, reflect a Christ-like image. It's not easy but I'm not giving up cause the Word says that; "He who started at the good work in you will also finish what He started," so I'm gonna just trust Him with what He's doing in my life.

I realize my dad grew up with no father so how would he know how to be one? I suffered for it. But like you always tell us, we're KINGS! So we don't have to live according to another's legacy; a king establishes his own legacy. I don't have to do what my father did.

I've got nine months left. Thank God this is almost over and God is in the forefront of my life. He should've been there before but the past is the past for a reason and the future is hopeful in God. God has been blessing me although some things happen but I can take them to God, and He handles it and teaches me how to avoid problems. So that's even more reasons to love God!!!

When I was locked in my cell, I prayed and started thinking: "What am I gonna do? Run away like Jonah?" I already know what would happen if I run away. So I decided to submit, full submission. And the biggest vision the Lord has given me ever since is: "You've got a lot of work to do." I love God a lot, too much to deny His calling.

I had to lose everything in order to gain everything, having the shackles from my eyelids removed to be given sight. The Lord has placed a calling in my life to minister His Word to those whom are lost without hope. The Lord has blessed my hands with a trade and has placed on my heart to teach those coming out of prison a trade so that a man who only knows the streets will be given a chance to make an honest living...

I have six months left and the closer the time gets, the more anxious I feel. Sometimes I get scared because I don't want to be the same person I was even though I know I've changed. I think it's just the change that I'm scared of.

In all of these excerpts, you can see how significant a little gesture can be and how much, even the tiniest glimmer of hope can impact someone who feels lost and afraid. These young men have such enormous strength of character. They need only have these qualities strengthened, rather than diminished. They need faith placed in them, hope surrounding them and love in them.
